Reflection and prayers for week of 2 to 9 June from Carolyn

I have enjoyed a little search on the expansive and varied “Thy Kingdom Come” website and encourage you over the Ascension weekend to go digging for treasure yourselves.

As Peta Tracey has said below – “Thy Kingdom Come” is a global wave of prayer, inviting Christians worldwide to pray between Ascension and Pentecost – on the broad theme “Thy Kingdom Come.” I found the words of Shane Claiborne inspiring.

“When we pray “thy Kingdom come” we are trying to bring God’s dream on earth as it is in heaven, right into our neighbourhood.”

He points out that prayer can be a place to hide, when we don’t know what else to do. However, he argues that prayer is also the starting point which may well lead to action.

“Prayer is not just about us getting God to do what we want him to do – but about us getting ourselves to do what God wants us to do and to become who God wants us to become.” He spent some time learning to pray with Mother Teresa and her sisters, getting up every morning at 5am and kneeling before the cross. The prayers were all about Jesus filling them with himself – with these words:

“Jesus, may every person I come into contact with feel your love in my soul, may I leave your fragrance everywhere I go.”

Shane describes prayer as “a way of becoming like our God, and so we get up off our knees and seek the Kingdom on earth as it is in heaven.”

He concludes: “Our faith is not just a ticket into heaven and a licence to ignore the world around us. Our faith is about bringing God’s dream on earth. So let us pray, Thy Kingdom Come, and then let us seek first the Kingdom of God on earth as in heaven.”
