Reflection and prayer for week of 3 to 10 November from Carolyn

In many parts of the globe, Halloween celebrations are underway this week. Halloween itself simply means the eve of all Hallows, and All Hallows is the Christian "All Saints Day", a day when we think particularly of people past and present who have reflected the light of Christ for us and to us. It is followed immediately on November 2nd by All Souls Day when we remember all the souls who have gone before us into the light of Heaven.

At the turning of the year, as the days darken and shorten, the pre-Christian traditions used to make offerings for the souls of the dead. The poet Malcolm Guite observes: "Our Christian hope is that the greatest and only offering, to redeem both the living and the dead, has been made by Christ."

He has written a sonnet to reclaim this season for All Souls/All Saints. The poem points to the light of Christ shining through the words and quiet lives of saints – both "plain in our sight" and "far beyond our seeing." "All are gathered up in the web of being... where all saints are known and named."

All Saints

Though Satan breaks our dark glass into shards

Each shard still shines with Christ's reflected light,

It glances from the eyes, kindles the words

Of all his unknown saints. The dark is bright

With quiet lives and steady lights undimmed,

The witness of the ones we shunned and shamed.

Plain in our sight and far beyond our seeing

He weaves them with us in the web of being

They stand beside us even as we grieve,

The lone and left behind whom no one claimed,

Unnumbered multitudes, he lifts above

The shadow of the gibbet and the grave,

To triumph where all saints are known and named;

The gathered glories of His wounded love.

In a moment of quiet, I invite each of us to light a candle and offer up to Christ's redeeming love, those who have died recently – both those known to us personally, and victims of tragedies that have come to our attention.

Included in our prayers this week is Peter Harris, founder of the environmental charity A Rocha. His wife, Miranda Harris, and the CEO of A Rocha, Chris Naylor, and his wife, Susanna, died tragically in a car accident in South Africa. We pray for Sarah French, a member of our church who works for "A Rocha International" and who is supporting the

organisation at this time of shock and loss. Here is the press release.

On Monday 28th October Peter and Miranda Harris, co-founders of A Rocha, and Chris Naylor, A Rocha International CEO, together with his wife Susanna, were involved in an horrific car accident in Port Elizabeth, South Africa. Miranda, Chris and Susanna did not survive. Peter and the driver of the car are being treated at a local hospital and are in a stable condition.

Above all, their families and friends are held in our prayers. We know that this comes as a profound shock to everyone in the A Rocha Family and others all around the world.
