Reflection and prayer for week of 2 to 9 February from Carolyn

This weekend marks the end of the season of Christmas and Epiphany when we have been celebrating the mystery of God becoming a human being. We end the season with "Candlemas" – recalling the moment when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus into the temple for a blessing. The God-light is carried tenderly into the synagogue and held up by the aging prophet Simeon, announcing that this little baby is the longed-for "light for revelation to the Gentiles." We often think of light as a blaze of brightness, but it also comes in small, humble flickering candles and in understated words and interactions between one another. Malcolm Guite's poem evokes the humility of the new parents presenting Jesus at the Temple.

The light was coming into the Temple in a new way, and we mark this in our service by lighting all the church candles with a large central light representing the Christ Light. As you read this sonnet by Malcolm Guite, use the imagery to help you pray for God's peace and kindled light to shine in and through your life for his love's sake.

They came, as called, according to the Law.

Though they were poor and had to keep things simple,

They moved in grace, in quietness, in awe,

For God was coming with them to His temple.

Amidst the outer court's commercial bustle

They'd waited hours, enduring shouts and shoves,

Buyers and sellers, sensing one more hustle,

Had made a killing on the two young doves.

They come at last with us to Candlemas

And keep the day the prophecies came true;

We share with them, amidst our busyness,

The peace that Simeon and Anna knew.

For Candlemas still keeps His kindled light,

Against the dark our Saviour's face is bright.
