Reflection and prayer for week of 9 to 16 February from Carolyn

Looking back to last weekend, we have so much for which to give thanks: for Dave and Pat Tomlinson's visit, for our community day on Saturday, Holy Joes in Divonne, our Sunday afternoon Candlemas celebration on Sunday and an eye-opening Enneagram workshop on Thursday. May I take this opportunity to thank all of you who have helped in any way with these gatherings and who have prayed for them and attended them where you can. We thank God for his rich blessing on our community.

At the same time, many in our church family have been shocked and saddened by the sudden passing away of Surush, a young Iranian man who was baptised and confirmed at La Côte Church. We had the privilege of getting to know him when he arrived from Iran seeking refuge, four years ago, and through him of welcoming in further refugees in similar plights.

We are holding a funeral for him at the Temple de Nyon on Wednesday 12 February at 14:00, followed by a burial in the Nyon cemetery. All in our church community who knew him are welcome to attend to support those close to him and to honour his life. Please keep this service in your prayers too. We commend Surush with sadness and thanksgiving to God's infinite love and peace.

Dealing with extreme highs and lows this week has drawn me to find rest in the rhythms of nature. Last weekend marked the beginning of the Spring Season rooted in the Pagan and Celtic festivals of St Brigid and of Imbolc. The invitation in my Mystic Christ Calendar is to savour the world around us, with open hearts and minds:

"The spring season is a time to celebrate childlike innocence, exploring, wonder; the asking of questions and the pursuit of truth and justice. It is also a time to remember and give thanks for those who are our spiritual midwives, nurturers and mentors. Be present to the moment, looking for God in all things. Practise gratitude and appreciation, realising our dependence on God's goodness."

Here is a poem by Wendell Berry, tuning in to the soothing presence of God's grace in the world.

The peace of wild things

When despair for the world grows in me and I wake in the night at the least sound in fear of what my life and my children's lives may be, I go and lie down where the wood drake rests in his beauty on the water, and the great heron feeds. I come into the peace of wild things who do not tax their lives with forethought of grief. I come into the presence of still water. And I feel above me the day-blind stars waiting with their light. For a time I rest in the grace of the world, and am free.
