CORONAVIRUS UPDATE AND LA CÔTE CHURCH WORSHIP

SUNDAY CHURCH SERVICES

- 1. We will be reviewing the situation a week at a time
- 2. For this coming Sunday 15th March La Côte Church will not be meeting for worship together in Gingins.
- 3. We have decided that our priority is to be in line with the government recommendations, which are to look after the most vulnerable in our community and to delay the spread of COVID-19.
- **4.** We are sorry to have to do this and are aware that some of our community are particularly isolated and fearful. We would like to find ways to stay in touch and care for one another. For starters please find attached our church order for Sunday. Carolyn will be sending out a reflection on our Gospel story either written or possibly even recorded by Sunday afternoon.
- **5.** Next week members of our council will meet to explore ways for our church to stay in contact with and support one another during this uncertain time.
- **6.** We have had the backing of our Archdeacon, Adele Kelham, to take these measures.
- 7. Please let Liz or Carolyn know if you are sick or quarantined, or if you are feeling isolated and would like to be in touch with someone.

SMALL GROUP GATHERINGS

For the time being we feel that our small group meetings can continue to take place while taking good care to follow the current safety recommendations:

- a. If anyone has flu-like symptoms including a dry cough, fever, or breathlessness that they do not attend the meetings.
- b. If anyone has been in contact with someone who has been infected, that they do not attend.
- c. Those attending wash their hands regularly, and thoroughly and use hand-sanitizer.
- d. That members of the group refrain from hand-shakes, hugs or kisses when greeting one another and that they maintain a sensible social distance from one another during the meeting.
- e. It is wise to share refreshments in a way that does not involve hands dipping into the same plate or bowl.

The Wardens and Chaplain are monitoring the situation closely, in line with local authorities. Several members of the congregation who are working closely with WHO's outbreak response are keeping us informed and we will continue to assess the situation as it evolves.

We will make a decision regarding the AGM in due course.

Reflection and prayer for week of 15 to 22 March from Carolyn

This week the St Alban's Diocese in the Church of England tweeted "The Bishop's Coronavirus Golden Rules". They offer a refreshing reminder of attitudes to nurture in the midst of this pandemic. I share them here, slightly adapted for our community, with permission from St Alban's Diocese.

"The Bishop's Coronavirus Golden Rules"

This is not official advice: but this is food-for-thought about our attitudes.

Golden Rule One. Each one of us can think about how we can protect and support our neighbours. So much of the public rhetoric is sowing fear about the danger of other people. So, taking all the official precautions, offer help and reassurance to others – and don't demonise anyone or any group.

Golden Rule Two: Think about who may be suffering more than me. For those of us who are healthy there is much less to worry about but the elderly, the housebound and those with chronic health conditions may be very anxious. How about each church undertaking an audit of all the vulnerable people they know and sharing out the responsibility to phone them each day. There's nothing like a friendly voice to offer solace when someone is worried. A smile can bring cheer, even on the phone. If you visit, follow all the official precautions or don't go.

Golder Rule Three. Don't give into panic and start hoarding food. There is plenty to go around, so practise the Christian discipline of sharing. Ask your neighbours what they need and do you best to help them get it. If you are self-isolating you will of course need some supplies.

Golden Rule Four. Live today to the full. None of us ever know what the future holds. In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 6.25 - 34), Jesus challenged his followers to live each day fully and not be afraid. Every time we are tempted to give in to fear we need to make a conscious choice to respond in trust and openness.

And don't forget to pray. Here's a suggestion from the Revd Louise Collins, a Team Vicar in Borehamwood, Herts, UK:

Dear God our Shield and our Defender, guide and protect my neighbours in this time of health emergency; deliver them from all harm and may your love and care ever grow in this place. Through Jesus Christ, Our Lord, Amen.
